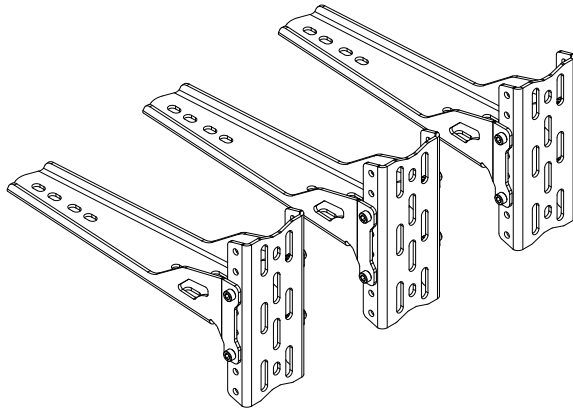

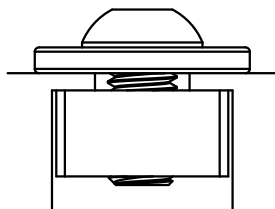
Which hardware you'll need.

We've made sure to source all the hardware you'll need for your specific type of roof rack, so you can get your recovery boards up as hassle-free as possible.

We supply a variety of fastening hardware to suit different racks, this means you will have excess hardware after the installation is completed.

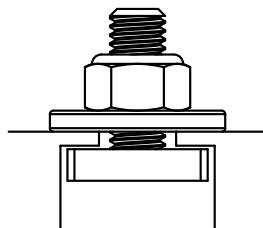
Rhino-Rack / Yakima / Cross Bars

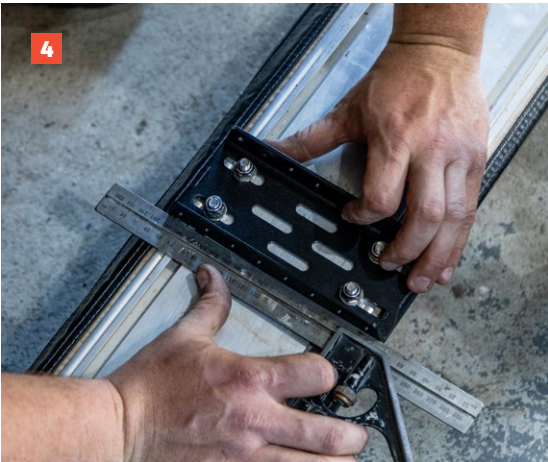

Let's get to work.

Attaching the Adjustable Awning Bracket

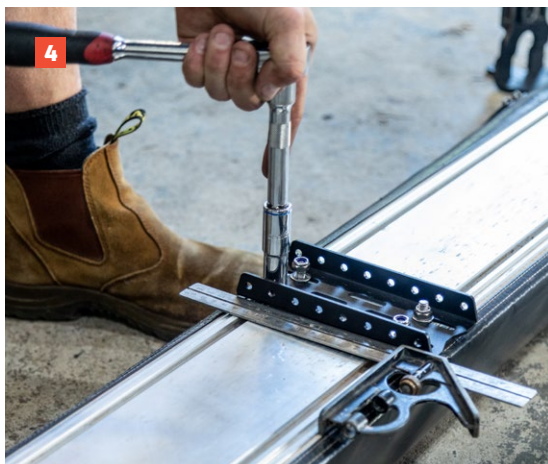
1. It's best if we get the Awning Brackets attached to the awning first. Due to the sheer number of awning variations, we can't supply the hardware for this. So if you don't have the required hardware on hand, a trip to the shops may be in order.
2. First, confirm placement of the brackets. Starting with the outer brackets first, work out the desired spacing in relation to your racks overall length.

For platform style racks, brackets should be placed close to a cross brace or roof leg to minimise flex in the roof rack, and create the most direct load path. It's also worth placing the back two brackets further towards the back of the rack at the awning hinge. Twisting and lifting loads are higher at the corner and the brackets help brace and stabilise the roof rack. After this, confirm the height setting you want to use for the Adjustable Awning Bracket, so that it clears your vehicle setup.

3. Most awnings use a channel system, so insert the bolts into the channel and slide them into position. Each bracket requires either one or two bolts and nuts in the each channel.
4. Loosely tighten each, and check that the bracket is sitting square with the awning before tightening with a socket. Repeat for all 3 brackets.

5. Using the height setting we confirmed earlier, attach the roof rack bracket to the awning bracket using the provided socket head cap screws and nyloc nuts.

6. Position the 9 tee bolts or channel nuts in the roof rack channels, roughly in their final position / spacing.
7. **For platform style racks with East to West Slats:** We recommend two tee bolts or channel nuts in the outer channel, and one in the slat in the innermost hole, as pictured.
8. **For platform style racks with North to South Slats:** We recommend two tee bolts or channel nuts in the outer channel, and one in the first slat next to the outer channel.
9. **For cross bar style racks:** We recommend placing two channel nuts in the closest holes to the awning, and the other in the furthest, as pictured.
10. This is the part where you'll need a mate to help. Lift the awning into the desired position, and hold in place while loosely finger-tightening the screw and washer into each channel nut, or nyloc nut and washer over each tee bolt.
11. Once you've confirmed placement of the awning, use a socket to tighten. Ensure that the awning's weight is supported until all screws are secured.
12. That's it! All that's left to do is to head to the beach, open your 270° awning and enjoy the shade.
